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#### Overview

Known as Fairbanks, the building at 3<sup>rd</sup> and Center Streets in Lewiston, New York was built by Joshua Fairbanks. Harriet Van Cleve inherited the house from her grandfather, Joshua. She lived here with her husband, James Van Cleve.



After a long career as Captain of several lake ships, Captain Van Cleve retired to the house in 1861 to write his three volume history of the Great Lakes ships and a history of Lewiston. The building is currently a private residence
