

Fort Conti Subject Area: Social Studies Grades 6-8

Overview:

Fort Conti was built in 1679 near Youngstown, New York on the site of Fort La Salle which was built in 1669... Fort Conti consisted of two log blockhouses, 40 foot square connected by palisades. It was built January 14-15, 1679 by Captain Robert Cavelier de La Salle. The post was named Fort Conti after Louis Armand de Bourbon, Prince of Conti, a patron of La Salle's lieutenant, Henri de Tonty. A barracks and warehouse was constructed 7 miles upriver at the foot of the gorge at former site of Fort Hennepin which had been built 1678. An upper camp for shipbuilding was also built at the end of the portage above the rapids at Cayuga Creek, near the later site of Fort Little Niagara which was built in 1745). Fort Conti was attacked in November by Seneca Indians. the fort's occupants escaped and the fort was burned. According to some accounts, carelessness caused the fire and abandonment.
