Fort Gray Subject Area: Social Studies Grades: 6-8

Overview

Fort Gray was built in 1812 in Niagara Falls. New York. It was located on the top of the Lewiston Escarpment opposite Queenstown. Named for its builder Nicholas Gray. Fort Gray was located on the site of an unnamed 1751 French Blockhouse/Storehouse and an unnamed 1764 British Blockhouse/Storehouse. It was attacked and destroyed in December 1813 by British forces.
