
History of the United States and New York

Students will:

Overview

The Red & White Store was located at 411 Center Street, Lewiston, New York. . It was built in 1863 by Moses & Abraham Baristo. A general store was built on land deeded from Amos Tryon to the Baristo. "Uncle Abe," a bachelor, was a merchant in business for 30 years after migrating from New Hampshire with his brother. After many years, the structure was converted to law offices. Currently, the building houses an insurance office.



Activity

Students will develop a map of the buildings on four hundred block of Center Street, Lewiston.
